





















In *Someone is on their period...* Honorata van den Akker and Lieke Smets will tell you all you need to know about your menstruation. Even if you haven't had your period yet. For example, they discuss hormones, the seasons of your cycle, birth control, perfumed pads, menstrual cups, practical tips for inserting tampons, and the difference between your vagina and your vulva. Goodbye menstruation taboos! Also, Honorata and Lieke share their own personal period stories. And those of eleven other people. Because it's time we openly talk about it.



HONORATA VAN DEN AKKER AND **LIEKE SMETS** started the Menstruation Cirls together, due to the PMDD-diagnosis of Honorata and the extreme menstrual pain of Lieke, and by doing so founded a menstruation empire that includes the Menstruation Cirls podcast, an online magazine, an Insta-account and this book. And they are just getting started. It can certainly feel a little awkward sometimes, but that's exactly what they are trying to change: menstruation needs to be a subject we can openly talk about. Honorata is also an illustrator and Lieke is a communication professional.

WILLEMIJN VAN DIJK THE ITALIAN PRINCESS



THE RESTLESS LIFE OF MARIANNE OF ORANGE-NASSAU

Marianne of Orange-Nassau (1810-1883), the infamous daughter of King William I, is the least known by far of the princesses of the Dutch royal family. At the age of twenty she married her first cousin Albrecht, but the marriage was deeply unhappy. Marianne ran away and reinvented herself as a freethinking art collector, composer and traveller. The discovery that she was having an affair with her coachman was explosive. After many peregrinations she moved into Villa Celimontana in Rome, which she transformed into a refuge for Dutch artists and a cultural salon for the higher social circles. In that sun-drenched yet shadowy world she decided she no longer could, nor should, keep her biggest secret to herself.

In *The Italian Princess* Willemijn van Dijk reconstructs the forgotten life of an unknown princess. Against the background of a rapidly changing Europe, she describes beautifully Princess Marianne's valiant fight for her revolutionary ideals.



The life story of a forgotten princess – an account of courage, freedom, great aspirations and a small measure of happiness.



LOES HEGGER VILLA DE WARTBURG

THE STORY OF A FAMILY AND A HOUSE FULL OF RELIGIOUS REFUGEES



Loes Hegger grew up in a family of seven children. After her father left his monastery, he and his wife decided to receive lapsed priests into the family. De Wartburg, named after Martin Luther's castle became a place of asylum. The need was great. Those leaving monastic life lost both status and identity, and furthermore they were cast out by family and friends. Some even feared for their lives. People streamed in from all over the world, like Renato from Italy, Aniano from Spain, Orlando from Venezuela, Gust from Belgium and Thottil from India. Sixty years after the opening of De Wartburg in 1962, Hegger reconstructs her unusual childhood in an assured literary style. She investigates the eventful life of the former priests and describes how their decision to leave the silence of the monastery brought them to a large family in a Dutch village. It was a lively community with weddings, babies and unusual habits. Their personal stories are linked to social developments in politics, culture and religion, enabling the book to paint a revealing picture of how history is reflected in the lives of ordinary people.



LOES HEGGER Loes Hegger's studies included a period at the École Internationale Formation Théâtrale in Paris. She works as an actor, director, teacher and scriptwriter. Villa De Wartburg is her first book.

RIK KUIPER THAT ONE PUPIL

TEACHERS ON THE PUPILS WHO CHANGED THEIR VIEWS FOREVER



Which pupil made you look at your profession differently? Most teachers don't need to think for very long in order to answer that question. The girl who rang my doorbell one evening, they'll say. That pupil who wanted to come and live with me. That kid with the knife. The lad who deradicalized in my classroom. The one we decided to give the benefit of the doubt. They are the children discussed in the interviews Rik Kuiper publishes every week in his series 'That One Pupil' in de Volkskrant - cheerful, touching or moving stories that take the reader into the classroom, through the door that usually remains shut. They show what education is all about: the relationship between teacher and pupil. The stories collected here show the dilemmas teachers struggle with, the doubts they experience and the things they've got wrong in the past. They are also about what the teachers themselves have learnt. What did they start to do differently after having that one pupil in their classroom?



CASPER LUCKERHOF RESTLESS



STRANDED IN THE LAND OF THE BUDDHA

In 2017 Casper Luckerhof travels to Nepal. He plans to write a book about the Buddha, Asia's greatest philosopher, that will unmask him as a power-hungry sect leader. It's the only way for Casper to draw a line under a childhood full of spirituality and to prove to his parents that he can live his own life.

But events take an unexpected turn. In Lumbini, where the Buddha was born 2,500 years ago, he is offered a job in the world's largest Buddhist library. In an institute that seems built like a fortress, he works with a German Tibetologist and an Italian academic. Casper's main task is to keep visitors out; the institute is their secret. Shortly before his father comes to visit him, Casper loses everything as the result of a conflict. Disillusioned, he sets off with his father on an epic trip through the Himalayas. *Restless* is an enchanting memoir about an almost obsessive quest for independence, meaning and a place in the world. It is also the story of an improbable friendship between three men who, in a remote region of Nepal, eventually drive one another to despair.



CASPER LUCKERHOF is a historian and an expert on India. He writes for publications including de Volkskrant and De Groene Amsterdammer. In 2016 he published A Lonely Bridgebuilder: Travels through the India of P.A.S. van Limburg Brouwer.

MARJAN SLOB THE EMPTY SKY

A SHORT PHILOSOPHY OF LONELINESS



The word 'loneliness' is doing the rounds. Worried policymakers are taking steps to 'combat' loneliness among isolated elderly people and gaming youth. The concept itself, however, is little researched. In her new book, Marjan Slob presents 'loneliness' as the unpleasant feeling you get when experiencing an absence of interconnectedness. But loneliness is also a power. When you're lonely you suffer from what isn't there, which shows that you are capable of self-reflection and imagination. Slob makes this idea easy to grasp with the help of ideas from major thinkers including Blaise Pascal, Daniel Dennett and Simone de Beauvoir, but also from novels, films and pop songs. She playfully explores loneliness through phenomena like stage fright, masks, selfies, space travel, and primping and preening in the ladies toilets – with David Bowie as a guide who knows how you can play with your inescapable sense of being lost.



KLAAS-JAN HUNTELAAR

HOMAGE TO A GOAL-SCORING MACHINE




On 14 January 2021, Klaas-Jan Huntelaar came on in the 89th minute of a soccer match between FC Twente and Ajax. The score at that point was 1-1. Ajax had made nineteen vain attempts to force a second goal. Thirty-seven-year-old Huntelaar ran onto the pitch and within four minutes he made it 1-2 and then 1-3. Illustrative of the striker's eagerness is the fact that he scored more than 400 goals during his career, making him the first Dutch footballer ever to pass the 400-goal mark for club and country.

In *Klaas-Jan Huntelaar*, a range of prominent authors pay homage to this goal-scoring machine. Their stories take us to a great list of clubs where the striker excelled and together they form a full account, narrative and anecdotal, of a glittering career.



The daily grind of work makes her restless and her boyfriend Taco doesn't understand her. She is also struggling with persistent depression, which raises its head from time to time. Online she meets Raavi, a photographer from India, and a close relationship between them develops. She resolves to travel to Asia. Her first destination is Mumbai, to meet Raavi. When Raavi turns out to be a young woman, Helena feels greatly confused. They spend a few days together and Helena realizes that she is capable of feeling fierce, fervent love for a woman. But Raavi's sexual identity is a threat to her own safety and that of her loved ones. Helena has to choose between two continents as she struggles with the emptiness and absurdity of existence.



AUKE HULST THE MITSUKOSHI COMFORT BABY COMPANY

MONUMENTAL NOVEL BY A CELEBRATED AUTHOR

In a near future, a lonely science-fiction writer buys a robot daughter intended to make up for the loss of an unborn child. Meanwhile he works on a novel in which his alter ego goes back in time with the aim of changing the course of history, so that his unborn child can be born after all, if only in a story. Will reality and fiction succumb to coercion in the hands of a writer? *The Mitsukoshi Comfort Baby Company* is an ambitious combination of memoir, robot story, time-travel tale and alternative history, in which loss, guilt and parenthood are central. In this gripping novel, Hulst demonstrates both the power and the limitations of fiction.






AUKE HULST made his breakthrough in 2012 with an autobiographical novel called *Children of the Rough Country*, which has since been reprinted twenty times. His work has won him many prizes. As well as being an author, Hulst is a songwriter and a literary critic.

ROBERT POLLACK THE FOUR ELEMENTS

THREE GENERATIONS UNDER THE SPELL OF NAZI-I OOTED ART



German industrialist Bernhard Wenzel is accused of using his company to hide four valuable paintings, 'The Four Elements', which were stolen from a Jewish family by the Nazis during the Kristallnacht. Wenzel aspires to a political career and needs to avoid this scandal. It is lawyer Leo Spier's job to help him.

But what actually happened eighty years ago? Bernhard's father wasn't allowed to marry the half-Jewish woman he loved, because the family firm was dependent on the German war industry. Did 'The Four Elements' play a part even back then?

For Leo Spier this delicate case is an immense challenge, not only because of his Jewish background but also because he finds himself up against Christine Lavergne, a French lawyer with whom he has a past.



ROBERT POLLACK (pseudonym) is regarded as an authority in the field of Nazi-looted art. He used to be a partner in a large international law firm and among his clients was the Dutch parliament. After almost twenty-five years in the legal profession, he made his debut as a writer, while continuing to work part-time as a judge. His first novel, The Task, was well received by the Dutch press.

Arghavan is a young Iranian woman. A newcomer to the Netherlands, she struggles to build a new life but is plagued by memories of her youth in Iran. A youth that began as an idyll but took a turn for the worse when her mother suddenly abandoned the family and her father, her anchor, became addicted to opium. She made a radical decision: to leave the mountain landscape of Iran for good, and emigrate to the flattest place on earth: the Netherlands. Arghavan works in an Amsterdam thrift store, where she strikes up a friendship with a few of the customers. The country amazes her, this place where everyone is in a hurry and where really connecting with one another seems an impossibility. Then she falls in love with Mees, a young musician, and her world is turned upside down.

GETTING OLDER, DESCRIBED WITH UNUSUAL SENSITIVITY AND LIGHTNESS OF TONE



Now aged seventy, Eduard Wakker recently moved into an apartment complex for people of sixty-five and over. The highpoint of his week is participating in the working group Rituals After the Death of a Fellow Resident. His wife died a year and a half ago. Eduard knows that life simply goes on. And that it isn't easy. But he could never have suspected that the sense of loss would be so great. He makes notes and tries to commit their shared happiness to paper. His memories take him back to their holidays in Italy, where they were married. With his friend and fellow resident Wally, Eduard often walks from the flat to the café and back. They check their phones to count how many steps they've totted up. They talk about their lives and the paths they have taken, and as Wally's memory declines, Eduard gradually wins his life back from his wife's death. The novel Counting Steps is deceptively breezy in tone. Beneath the humour lies the central character's grief, to which he refuses to succumb out of love for his wife.



HENK SPAAN is editor-in-chief of the football magazine *Hard gras*. He has published a number of poetry collections inspired by football and writes a column for *Het Parool* almost daily. His impressive non-fiction book *Nouri*, about the promising young footballer Abdelhak Nouri, was a bestseller.
