

### BO HANNA BABA

## SEEKING THE TANGLED TRUTH ABOUT MY ABDUCTION BY MY FATHER

240 pp - May 2024



In *Baba*, Bo Hanna explores his shocking family history and examines what it means for a child to be abducted by one of its own parents. At the age of four, Bo Hanna is kidnapped along with his twin brother and older brother. Their father picks the boys up from their nursery in Stockholm and takes them to relatives in Cairo. Six months later they leave for the Netherlands, where they end up living. And what about their mother? Their father tells them she is dead.

As a teenager, Bo Hanna begins to doubt the intentions of his father, who to the outside world was an amiable man but who was also very unpredictable at home. When Bo's mother turns out not to be dead and suddenly reappears in their lives, his father treats her as the guilty partner. More than twenty years after the abduction, many questions remain unanswered. How much of the story is true and what role did Bo's mother play in it all?



**BO HANNA** studied Language and Literature at the University of Amsterdam, with a specialization in French and Middle Eastern studies. He works as an independent journalist and has been published in *Vice, de Volkskrant, De Morgen* and other media. Children's and human rights issues are central in his work.



#### STORIES TOLD BY A DEVOTED VETERINARIAN



In Wonderful Pets and Their Amazing Owners, veterinarian Joyce Hofman recounts striking, funny, touching, disconcerting and bizarre tales about situations she has experienced with animals and their owners in her practice.

An owner who comes to collect his rabbit, which has just undergone five hundred euros' worth of surgery, and buys a bag of rabbit meat for his dog before leaving. The owner of a cat that required three skin transplants after an accident and came to the clinic three times a week over a period of six months. The lady who criss-crosses the city on the tram with her goldfish in a plastic storage box in search of a vet who can explain why they are swimming so strangely. Pomeranians with their own private spa at home. Every patient is different, as is every owner. And every situation requires a different approach.

In addition to these real-life stories, Joyce Hofman also writes about ethical issues and the fascinating relationship between humans and animals and how it has evolved over time.



JOYCE HOFMAN (Rotterdam, 1982) studied Veterinary Medicine and Film Science at Utrecht University. She started her career in the tropics, where she learned that veterinary medicine requires not only medical knowledge but also experience and practical skills. She runs three veterinary practices in Amsterdam, where she lives with her husband, daughter, son, their Italian stray dog Oscar and a pet rat.

In *Cordoned Off*, thirteen professionals recall the crime scene that changed their professional or personal lives forever. The one crime scene that made such an impression it has been indelibly etched into their memory.

It usually starts with a call to 911: a bedroom in flames, a stabbing involving a child, a gruesome rape in a dark forest or a seemingly natural death that turns out to be a murder after all.

Death, grief and confusion: everything comes together at the scene of a crime. When the call comes in, the experts are summoned: a forensic investigator or a coroner who applies their expertise to the crime scene.

# ON MY KNEES

#### REFLECTIONS ON RECOVERY

February 2021. While loading the car the day before he and his wife Harriët plan to drive back to the Netherlands from their house in France, Henk misjudges the steps down from the front door and trips and falls. He lands hard on his left knee and when he tries to stand up he falls again, this time on his right knee. The result: torn tendons in both knees. At the height of the Covid pandemic, Henk Spaan suddenly finds himself confined to a hospital bed in his own living room. His physio insists that in order to recover he must push himself through the pain barrier every day. In the meantime, Harriët is burdened with a never-ending list of exhausting chores and her husband's recovery can't go quick enough as far as she's concerned. The same goes for Henk, who struggles with his growing sense of shame every day.

He applies himself manfully to working on his novel, his newspaper columns and his podcast, feeding them with memories as he lies stricken in bed. His French neighbours offer their help, albeit sparingly.



**HENK SPAAN** is a writer and columnist and also editor of the football magazine *Hard Gras*. He has published several non-fiction books, poetry collections and novels. His highly acclaimed book *Nouri*, which tells the tragic story of the talented young footballer Abdelhak Nouri, was published in 2018 and became an instant bestseller.



Legal scholar Philip Wachtman's career is in the doldrums. His PhD on the anonymity of sperm donors has become redundant and it seems unlikely he will be granted academic tenure. The contrast with his partner, the successful voiceover actress Freya de Koning, couldn't be greater. But for Freya, too, there is a gaping hole: she is 39 and still childless. She is convinced the problem lies with Philip. But he knows something that she doesn't: Wachtman has an estimated 411 children, the result of excessive 'practical research' at his friend Dr. Dumortier's sperm bank. A court order may force Wachtman to reveal his secret. Pursued by his past, and by a student who claims to be his daughter, he must go in search of himself.

Ex-rapper and struggling mid-lifer Aad has forgotten an important family weekend. He pulls out all the stops to prove to his wife, an internationally renowned fitness guru, and his know-it-all children that he can reach their destination without difficulty and on time. However, technical glitches, cheese ninjas and his own scrambled mind, pretensions and frustrations all combine to impede his progress. As he continues his trip by land, sea and air in true slapstick fashion, it becomes clear that it is not only Aad's honour that is at stake but also the future of humankind.

Hassle is an odyssey whose goal remains uncertain until the very end. Needless bullshit, existential crises and steely determination trade places in rapid succession, while, amidst the chaos, the true destiny of Aad the anti-hero begins to reveal itself.



# MARK H. STOKMANS MIRROR DAYS

#### **COMPELLING FAMILY EPIC**

Three years after the death of his grandfather and the disappearance of his wife Pepa, Ruben Kruijssen is tasked with selling the Alquería, their family home in Spain. Fed up with his job as a real estate agent in Utrecht, Ruben decides to travel to Spain.

Back in the place where he spent all his summers, the memories soon begin to resurface of the great times he had there as a child, but also of tension in his family and trouble with some of the locals. Why does no one ever talk about the role his grandfather Herman played in the Spanish Civil War? How did Pepa come into Herman's life and why was her love so important to him and to their children? How well did Ruben actually know her? And why did she disappear?

During the months that Ruben spends in the Alquería, it slowly dawns on him how important his own perspective on his family's history is and where his heart lies. But to keep the Alquería he must first find Pepa.

Mirror Days is a fascinating novel about the subtleties of history, about new generations who have to come to terms with their family's past while also trying to find their own way.



The paths of Eduardo Eliades and Maria Marguiris da Silva unexpectedly cross against the backdrop of 1920s revolutionary Brazil. Inspector and coffee baron Eduardo must solve a mysterious murder, while at home his marriage is collapsing. Dancer and secretary Maria is looking for a way to stand on her own two feet, but her intense love for a wayward young man is proving to be overwhelming.

Both their lives spiral out of control. Eduardo is eager to do the right thing, even if it's against the interests of his own ruling class, and Maria wants to guard her newfound self-confidence at all costs. Traditional values no longer apply to either of them, but what can they replace them with? When Tara is cleaning out her deceased mother's neglected home, she finds a seemingly endless pile of artifacts from a distant past. With a mixture of revulsion and relief, she works her way through the clutter and soon the memories begin to surface: her father's childhood in the colonial Dutch East Indies; the chilly welcome in the motherland; the painful silence of parents traumatised by their experiences in Japanese Internment camps and the resulting effect on children who are unable to understand why their parents prefer to hold their tongues. While belongings are being sorted out, meaningful items separated from junk and the house prepared for sale, hidden letters and tapes turn up and by and by family secrets are starting to unravel. The past slowly finds a place in the present. Tara attempts to break through the transgenerational trauma, as there is no need to remain silent any longer.



In 1989, at the age of twenty-one, Marie suddenly decides to leave the Netherlands. She finds work in Paris as an au pair and tries to build a new life for herself. The unfamiliar language, the thankless work in a complicated family and the impressive but unforgiving city offer her the anonymity she longs for.

Half a lifetime later, Marie's story reaches her former photography teacher, Flo, the person who caused her to flee. The news is full of images from Paris of the terrorist attacks on 13 November 2015 on café terraces and at De Bataclan in which Flo turns out to have been involved. Flo, the teacher who moulded her, who taught her the difference between looking and seeing, between observing and telling a new story, who gave her the mental tools she needed to build herself up again. But Flo is also the teacher who grossly betrayed Marie's trust and prompted her flight to Paris.

I Know A Mountain That's Waiting For Me tells the story of the Aras River in Iran and the nomadic people that camp on its banks. Lovingly, but also with a hint of jealousy, the river observes how Saray becomes a young woman and how a childhood love turns into an adult relationship with Aydin.

Among the people living by the river is an old carpet weaver, who also weaves stories, and Doeman, who is different from the others and has eyes that appear to be blind but are able to see what others do not perceive. And Ashik, who sings about everything that belongs to the lives of these people: the animals, the mountains and, last but not least, the river Aras. Every once in a while a trader comes by to exchange sweets, hand creams, combs and other items for the weaver's wonderful carpets. On one occasion he is accompanied by a woman who has travelled from a faraway land, where she also lives by a river.



SHOLEH REZAZADEH (1989) came to the Netherlands from Iran in 2015. Her debut novel *The Sky Is Always Purple* (2021) sold more than 40,000 copies and was awarded the Debut Award of the Society of Dutch Literature in 2022 and the Bronzen Uil Readers Award in 2021.
